What will you study?

In Religious Studies we give students the opportunity to study a range of perspectives different from their own. The first two modules of the course are mandatory and we are excited to offer a consultation with our students on the Religion we will study in Year 13. Previously, this has been Buddhism but we are excited to open this decision to our new cohort in Septemeber. The course is split into 3 parts; Philosophy of Religion, Ethics and Buddhism. You will start with timeless questions such as, 'What is reality?', and examine arguments for the existence of God, including whether religious experience is to be believed.

Future pathways

Religious Studies is valuable for all careers which rely on sensitivity to different religions and values, and there is a growing recognition of the importance of the subject as preparation for a range of pathways including medicine, law, education, social work and the public sector. It is also useful training for careers which rely on the ability to write and evaluate, such as journalism and law.
